

Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting for Thurgarton held in the Village Hall, on Thursday May 25, 2017.

Coun. Charles Day, vice chairman of the parish council, was elected as chairman for the meeting in the absence of the chairman of the parish council, Coun. Tina Tsoukatos through being unwell, and welcomed nine residents and Newark and Sherwood District Council member Coun. Roger Jackson.

1] Minutes from Annual Parish Meeting May 10, 2016

were presented and accept as correct and signed by the chairman.

2] Chairman's report

The meeting chairman presented the annual report from the parish council chairman Coun. Tsoukatos. No matters were raised from it.

3] Finance report

Parish clerk Mike Elliott presented the annual accounts report and said the council had Ended the 2016-7 financial year with a balance of £15,127 59p in hand, including a sum of £1189 69 held in the Reserve Account. Income during the year had included the precept which the parish council had set at £5,500. There had been a sum of £3,016 received from Newark and Sherwood District Council through the Community Infrastructure Levy.

5] Public discussion

The meeting was told that the accounts of the council for 2016-7 would be shown on the village website and notice board once they had been audited and during the stipulated time for this.

Notts County Council member Roger Jackson was congratulated on his recent election success. He said the new controlling group had given an assurance they would look to spend the money they had more evenly that the previous controlling group had done.

Discussion took place on the Neighbourhood Plan which had been overwhelmingly supported through the statutory Referendum which had taken place earlier in the month.

The question of the village Broadband service was raised and them meeting was told by the meeting chairman that he understood by February next year the service available in the village will have been updated as necessary.

The question of a flooding problem on Beck Street was raised, coupled with the current effort being made to introduce the pre-warning system which local residents on Beck Street had the opportunity to take advantage of.

New village road signs had been erected on the entrances to the parish and had been well received.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 8-40pm.
